Résumé :

The major objective of this workshop is to contribute to an international comparison of collaborative research in education in Europe and beyond.

To do so, this workshop will bring together participants to the CIDREE (Consortium of Institutions for Development and Research in Education in Europe) expert meeting, which will be held on May 29th & 30th at IFé, and members of the LéA network so that they can share information and experience about collaborative research in education.

During this workshop, the participants to the CIDREE expert meeting will present their first results based on the comparison of collaborative research initiatives in education in their country (Austria, France, Hungary, Ireland, Luxemburg & Scotland). Then, two members of two different LéA (Lycées Argentré-Macé et Réseau d'Ecoles en Bretagne) will communicate about their experience of collaborative research. In doing so, they will try and identify the main driving forces for and obstacles to the development of collaborative research. Finally, Chongyang Wang, a doctoral student, will present some elements of her study of the way members of the Ampère LéA collaborate. She will compare her first observations of this LéA to the way collective work is organized in Teaching Research Groups, which combine teaching and scientific research in China. Following these presentations, the participants will try and map some of the characteristics of collaborative research in Europe and beyond.

All other LeA members are welcome to participate in this discussion that will take place in English with the CIDREE experts.
